Seehamster 4 for Cambodia

In mid-January, the newly designed Seehamster 4 (German for "Seahamster") for the cleaning and environmental education project in Cambodia 2018 was completed and approved by TÜV Bayern. The Seehamster is now on its way to its destination, where it will clean the heavily polluted Sangkae River in Battambang. Partner and sponsor of the one-year project are the SUND Holding GmbH + Co. KG, a group in the field of plastics manufacturing and sales. The official launch of the project was on March 1st.

New OEOO office in Kiel

At the beginning of the year, OEOO opened an office in Kiel as a new base in northern Germany. There, water samples are also being analysed for micro plastic. In addition, the sea elephant project will be launched there in March: within a year, a feasibility study will be carried out with experts.

Nomination for "Ocean Tribute" Award

OEOO was nominated for the Ocean Tribute Award in December. The award is dedicated to the most innovative and sustainable marine conservation ideas. It is praised from the Prince Albert II of



Monaco Foundation in cooperation with the German Sea Foundation and the water sports fair boot Düsseldorf. OEOO was one of three nominees in the Society category. We appreciate the recognition of our work.

Our activities

December 2017:

- One Earth One Ocean e.V. is nominated for the 2018

SEEKUH in Hong Kong

In mid-January, an OEOO team from Germany set out for Hong Kong. The goal of the media-supported one to two-month SEEKUH campaign in the 7.5-million-metropolis is to contribute to greater environmental awareness and publicize the concept of "Maritime waste collection" in Asia. In addition to cleaning actions with friendly environmental groups from Hong Kong in the heavily polluted waters and beaches of the metropolis, school classes and community groups will visit the SEEKUH in the coming weeks. In addition, lectures on the reduction of plastic are being held in everyday life.

In April the Seekuh goes on tour through Asia, the area with the most plastic waste worldwide. Next destination is Singapore.
